



ACOTE's Disclosure Statement regarding Probationary Accreditation-Inactive:

The occupational therapy assistant program at the **College of Southern Nevada, West Charleston Campus**, Las Vegas, Nevada, was placed on Probationary Accreditation effective August 5, 2011, for failure to comply with [2006 OTA Standards](#) A.2.2 (program director qualifications); A.2.3 (program director's experience); A.2.6 (at least one FTE faculty position); A.4.2 (publication of student outcomes); A.4.3 (publication of ACOTE contact information); A.5.1 (current strategic plan); A.5.2 (current faculty development plans); A.5.3, A.5.5, and A.5.6 (program evaluation); A.6.3 (program philosophy); A.6.5 (curriculum design); A.6.7 (course objectives and learning activities); B.5.13, B.5.21, B.5.22, B.5.25, B.7.7, B.7.8, B.8.3, B.9.2, B.9.3, B.9.4, B.9.5., B.9.9, B.9.12, and B.9.13 (content); B.10.1 (process for selecting fieldwork sites); B.10.4 (fieldwork coordinator's communication with fieldwork educators); B.10.5 (collaboration on establishing fieldwork objectives); and B.10.18 (resources for enhancing fieldwork supervision).

At its December 2011 meeting, ACOTE reviewed the Plan of Correction submitted by the occupational therapy assistant program and determined that the program's status remains Probationary Accreditation because the program continues to be in substantial noncompliance with the Standards.

The College of Southern Nevada reviewed the above statement and had the opportunity to add comment prior to public posting.

In a letter dated April 2, 2012, the College of Southern Nevada requested that the occupational therapy assistant program be placed on Inactive Status. At its April 2012 meeting, ACOTE voted to change the status of the program from Probationary Accreditation to Probationary Accreditation—Inactive, effective April 28, 2012.

Inactive status is a special status applied only to programs that are not currently enrolling new students and do not plan to enroll new students in the future. The status "inactive" does not replace any other current accreditation status. The designation follows the regular accreditation status (e.g., Accreditation—Inactive or Probationary Accreditation—Inactive). Students graduating from a program with Accreditation—Inactive or Probationary Accreditation—Inactive status are considered graduates of an accredited program.
