- Facilitating the development of children.

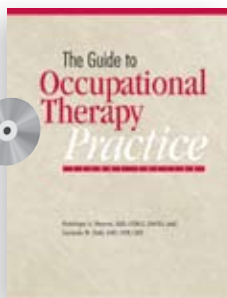
