

## Occupational Therapy Initial Licensure Application Checklist

**NOTE:** This checklist is not intended to provide official and inclusive instructions about how to apply for a state license as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant. The initial licensure application process varies from state to state. Contact the occupational therapy regulatory authority in the state where you want to apply, for information about required documents, deadlines, and procedures.

## **Important Notes:**

- State regulatory entities will not approve your application until all required documents are received.
- In most cases, original documents are required, rather than photocopies
- Having documents sent directly from your college or university or from NBCOT can expedite the application process and can make it more efficient for the state regulatory entity to process your application.
