






Exam Validation

Exam Analysis

We conduct statistical analyses on all aspects of our exams to affirm they accurately and fairly assess the essential knowledge for OT practice.





Question Enhancement

We continually review and validate the exam questions to confirm the exams continue to stay relevant, clear, and up-to-date with current OT practice.




On a scale from 1 to 10, where 1 is no anxiety and 10 is extreme anxiety, please rate your level of anxiety going into the exam.






How well do you think the classroom portion of your academic program prepared you for the exam?





Overall, how well do you think your fieldwork experiences prepared you for the exam?








Overall, how prepared did you feel to take the exam?









How interested are you right now in working in occupational therapy (as an OT or OTA)? 354 responses




How interested are you right now in working in occupational therapy (as an OTA or OT)? 403 responses




How informative was this presentation regarding career pathways in occupational therapy? 9 responses

occupational therapy, so it was


amazing to see how many were
